


Details About Gift Cards For A's Program

Gift cards will be distributed for the second quarter marking period in the village's Gift Cards For A's Program on Feb. 26 and 28 in the Village Hall Board Room.

Bellwood is partnering with Target stores to provide encouragement to students in 3rd – 8th grades who earn A's for academic excellence on their report card in the second and fourth grading periods ONLY. For each A a student earns in English, math, reading, science and social studies classes ONLY, they will receive a \$5 Target gift card.

Bellwood students who attend a school in Districts 87 or 88, or a school outside of the village can be rewarded for their excellence. Gift cards are presented when the student and a parent or guardian presents a qualifying report card with proof of residency. Report cards can only be presented once per grading period.
