6th Celebration and Counting for Surviving Warriors Group

On Oct. 3, the Surviving Warriors Breast Cancer Support Group, in partnership with the Village of Bellwood and Memorial Park District, hosted its 6th Annual Balloon Release and Candlelight Vigil to honor breast cancer survivors, those currently fighting the disease, and to remember individuals who earned their wings during their battle.

This year marks the 40th anniversary of Breast Cancer Awareness Month and the anniversary includes the encouraging news that the death rate has decreased by 44% with respect to the campaign and other advances.

Beyond the parade route, the fair provided residents with an array of services from state and county agencies, local nonprofits and community organizations, including healthcare, wellness screenings, resources for food insecurity, and connections to housing, mental health and family support programs.

Bridging the Gap also featured volunteers and partners who shared back-to-school information and study tips, while connecting families to tutoring, enrichment and after-school opportunities that will last beyond the first day of class.

Residents Learn At Property After Death Forum

An impressive number of Bellwood residents gained valuable insight about estate planning alternatives and the importance of having a plan to transfer their wealth to their loved ones or beneficiaries during a session presented by the Cook County clerk's office.

Representatives from the clerk's office shared information about the Cook County Transfer on Death Instrument and explained how to transfer property, a car and bank accounts to loved ones, how to protect property from fraud and theft through the Clerk's Office Property Fraud Alert Registration. Residents talked to licensed estate planning attorneys and legal professionals from the clerk's office.

A panel of volunteer attorneys with expertise in estate planning also dispensed knowledge at the standing-room only event hosted by Bellwood Mayor André F. Harvey and village staff.



Board of Review Hosts Tax Appeal Outreach

Dana Pointer from the Cook County Board of Review's office held an educational session that provided information on understanding property tax notices, and the appeals process on Sept. 25 at the Bellwood Village Hall.



The well-attended Tax Appeal Outreach event was presented by the Board of Review and Bellwood Mayor Andre F. Harvey, in partnership with Proviso Township, Cook County Commissioner Tara Stamps, Metropolitan Water Reclamation District and Rep. Omar Williams. The Board of Review provided helpful information for residents interested in appealing their property taxes.

The Cross-Community Climate Collaborative (C4) hosted its annual Mayors and Community Forum on Sept. 25 featuring mayors from the western suburbs who discussed sustainability priorities, shared challenges and learned from the successes of neighboring communities.
